
During the Revolution, allegations of rape by British soldiers in newspapers and pamphlets were construed as attacks on American rights, rather than as the violation of an individual.

Finally, a New Paradigm




In short, free American males could have owned firearms to further their personal happiness and should have owned firearms to help protect the community.
